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Community Resource Assessment Checklist¹

A community resource assessment can help identify potential resource gaps, build support for prevention efforts, and ensure a realistic match between the needs identified by the community and its available resources. Focus assessments on relevant resources related to the priority problem. Resources can include many factors beyond staff and financial support. Use the following checklist to help assess your community's resources.

☐ EXISTING COMMUNITY EFFORTS TO ADDRESS PREVENTION ISSUES	 In what ways can our agency build upon existing efforts? In what ways can our agency partner with those engaged in existing community efforts? What data collection efforts related to prevention already happen in the community?
☐ COMMUNITY AWARENESS OF THOSE EFFORTS	 To what extent is the community aware of those efforts? What evidence shows this level of community awareness? In what ways can the agency increase awareness of those efforts?
☐ SPECIALIZED KNOWLEDGE OF PREVENTION RESEARCH, THEORY, AND PRACTICE	 What specialized knowledge, if any, exists; and, to what extent can our agency leverage this knowledge?
☐ PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE WORKING WITH SPECIFIC POPULATIONS	 What specific populations does our agency have experience working with? To what extent does the problem relate to these specific populations?
☐ KNOWLEDGE OF THE WAYS THAT LOCAL POLITICS AND POLICIES HELP OR HINDER PREVENTION EFFORTS	 In what ways do local politics and policies help or hinder prevention efforts? What strategies can our agency implement to address these challenges?
